# WATER TEMPERATURE AND LEVELS

Was anyone else swimming this weekend? For the first time I can remember, we swam in the lake a lot over the May 2-4 weekend. The surface lake temperature was 19 - at our dock and out in the lake where the north and south basins meet. Compare that to summer temperatures: last August, the temperature only was 23.

You may have also noticed the lake water levels are high. OPG is working to manage the water levels on the entire Madawaska River waterway. Last fall, OPG began a project to upgrade the Bark Lake Dam. The warm weather, low snowpack level and little rain so far this spring has made the water level mangement more difficult. Now, they are holding back as much water as possible until levels in Bark Lake reach their normal height. According to OPG, flows on the Mad are 30% of normal for this time of year.

It will be interesting to see how the increasing nutrient levels, higher water temperatures and lower flow impact our lake this year.
